## University Information

Founded in 1970 by the State Legislature as the College of Medicine & Dentistry of New Jersey; granted University status in 1981.

4 main campuses: Newark, Stratford, Camden, Piscataway/New Brunswick; branch campus: Scotch Plains.

8 schools, plus Newark's University Hospital and University Behavioral HealthCare.

185 acres, 64 buildings, 7.7 million square feet.

Largest institution of its kind in the nation.

## External Funding

FY10 total external awards - \$372.5 million

46% provided by federal agencies

FY10 total external research awards - \$195.7 million

67% provided by federal agencies

UMDNJ ranked 92nd among research universities (680 participating) nationally in federally funded expenditures in FY 09 by the *National Science Foundation* (latest report).

UMDNJ has one of the most diverse health sciences student bodies in the nation and is a national leader in producing African American, Hispanic and Asian physicians. UMDNJ has consistently ranked among the top institutions in the nation in graduating minorities with medical degrees, ranking 2<sup>nd</sup> in graduating minorities with first professional degrees in medicine and 3<sup>rd</sup> after two historically black colleges in graduating African Americans with medical degrees in 2007, according to *Diverse Issues in Higher Education* (2007).

UMDNJ ranked fifth in graduating Latinos in allopathic medicine and sixth in osteopathic medicine. (*Hispanic Outlook*, volume 21, number 15, May 2, 2010). UMDNJ has 31 special enrichment programs that foster interest in the health sciences and provide academic support for high school and college students from all backgrounds.
